

JOBS ANNOUNCED BY ASSISTED COMPANIES

Ten assisted companies added 549 jobs to Nevada's economy in the second quarter of 2016; five companies are new to Nevada and five are existing companies expanding operations. Of the 10, three are in the healthcare industry, three are part of the manufacturing and logistics sector, two are information technology companies, and the balance are part of the tourism sector.

WAGES PAID BY ASSISTED COMPANIES

The average hourly wage paid by assisted companies in the second quarter was \$18.29. Worker pay for companies receiving incentives was \$18.60 per hour as compared to non-incentivized companies which pay, on average, \$15.25 an hour.







ASSISTED COMPANY INVESTMENT

Capital investment by assisted companies came in at \$42.1 million in the second quarter. This reflects a 73.4 percent decline from the previous quarter, and 16.1 percent below investments reported a year-ago.







No companies applied for Aviation Tax Abatements in the second quarter. Year-to-date, investment by the eleven companies approved for the abatement was \$832.8 million.







Capital investment made by companies approved for Data Center Tax Abatements came in at \$49.3 million in the second quarter. For the year, total capital investment by the four companies approved for Data Center abatements was \$3.2 billion.

GLOBAL RECRUITING

During the second quarter of 2016 GOED's International Trade Division executed a trade mission to Poland that was focused on helping Nevada companies with export opportunities. As a result there was little additional pipeline activity generated during the period.








INTERNATIONAL TRADE



OVERVIEW

- The current number of Certified Emerging Small Businesses (ESB's) has expanded by 18.3 percent since the end of last year to a total of 742.
- » Local Government agencies have until the end of September to report the number of solicitation or contract metrics for the first half of the year.
- » Annually GOED submits an ESB activity report of both state and local agencies to the Governor's Office, the Legislative Council Bureau, and posts it on the GOED Web site.

2016 GRANTS

- » 7 Economic Opportunity grants totaling \$1,493,108
- » 6 Suitable Living Environment grants totaling \$546,298
- » 1 Housing grant for \$200,000

GRANT PROGRESS

- » During the second quarter, three grants in two rural communities representing \$608,651 in CDBG funds were successfully closed. Collectively these projects contributed an additional \$175,833 in leveraged funds.
- » Closed grants in the quarter impacted over 33,000 Nevadans, of which, 96 percent were considered Low to Moderate Income (LMI).
- There are currently 39 open grants: 6 from 2014, 19 from 2015, and 14 from this year's program funds.

STRATEGIC OVERVIEW

» The reduction in the number of projects for 2016 is part of the ongoing strategy to intentionally fund large grants that have greater economic development impact. Over the past five years, the average amount awarded has nearly doubled and the percent of projects focusing on economic development priorities has more than tripled.


ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

NEVADA JOBS AND UNEMPLOYMENT

The number of workers in Nevada's economy continues to grow and currently stands at 1,290,100. This reflects an additional 31,900 positions when compared to this time last year and a recovery gain of 178,900 jobs since the recessionary low of 1,111,200 in September 2010.

The statewide unemployment rate currently stands at 6.5 percent; an improvement of 0.2 percent since this time last year and 7.2 percent from the recessionary high of 13.7 percent.

AEROSPACE AND DEFENSE



With the addition of 270 positions in the second quarter there are currently 13,100 workers employed in Nevada's Aerospace and Defense sector. Average annual earnings also improved by almost \$300 and now stand at \$81,336.

BUSINESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY



There were an additional 4,100 jobs added to Nevada's Business Information Technology sector in the fourth quarter. This reflects an annualized growth rate of 5.0 percent and brings the total employment base to 59,400. Annual earnings, on the other hand, dropped to \$47,000; a \$500 decrease from the previous quarter.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

HEALTH AND MEDICAL




Both earnings and job counts improved in Nevada's Health and Medical sector in the second quarter. An additional 3,900 jobs were added to the industry group for a total of 106,200 employees making an average of \$54,300 per year.

MANUFACTURING AND LOGISTICS



Job losses in Nevada's Manufacturing and Logistics sector earlier this year were recovered in the most recent quarter with the addition of 4,500 positions found mostly in transportation and warehousing operations. Wages, on the other hand, slipped by \$360 per year. Currently, there are 116,600 people employed in the sector making, on average, \$57,100 per year.

NATURAL RESOURCE TECHNOLOGIES



Job growth in Nevada's Natural Resource Technologies sector was essentially flat in the second quarter with the addition of 170 workers. Annual earnings grew by a slightly faster rate bringing average pay to \$63,000 per year.

ALL MANUFACTURING



Although there was a slight annual earnings loss of \$350 in Nevada's Manufacturing sector, job counts improved by more than 500 workers in the second quarter. Overall, Nevada's manufacturing sector now employs 42,500 workers with average annual earnings of \$56,400.

MINING

The three-year downturn in mining jobs reversed course in the second quarter with the addition of 300 positions. During the downturn the sector shed slightly over 3,400 jobs, while average annual earnings grew by \$7,800. Currently there are 13,400 workers employed by the mining industry with average annual earnings of \$91,000.



TOURISM, GAMING, AND ENTERTAINMENT

Both the number of jobs and annual earnings grew in Nevada's Tourism, Gaming, and Entertainment sector in the second quarter. When compared to last quarter an additional 3,000 jobs were added to the sector, with average earnings improving \$140 a year. In total, Nevada's largest industry sector now employees 416,000 workers who make, on average, \$32,300 per year.
